SAFETY TIPS FOR CYCLISTS

- Always wear a helmet that is properly fitted. Make sure it is adjusted so it
 covers the front of your forehead approximately the with of two fingers
 above your eyebrows. That the straps are snug enough to keep it in place
 if you have an accident.
- Always signal and look back before changing lanes or avoiding road hazards.
 When looking back you should look over your left shoulder, keeping your left
 shoulder steady, turn your head down and around to the left. Keeping your
 arms steady so that your bike moves straight. This will help you to keep a
 stead and moving in a straight line.
- Use hand signals when turning and stopping. Use verbal signals to let fellow cyclist know of road hazards and approaching vehicles.
- Riding position is always with the flow of traffic. Interesting fact, 20% of all automobile and cyclist accidents are caused by cyclist going in the wrong direction. Indiana law states that it is legal to ride 2 abreast, but in high traffic areas single file is better. Safe Bicycling in Indiana (page 15) states the following: Cyclist should ride on the right if your moving slow compared to traffic, but remember: The farther from the curb you ride, the better motorist can see you-whether they're in your lane, oncoming, or on cross street. Riding farther from the curb keeps cars from passing you on the left and then turning right immediately in front of you-and gives you room to avoid car doors, debris, and potholes.
- Cyclist should always carry identification, emergency contact information, and medical insurance card. As we all know there may be a rare times when you are unable to communicate and this information could be imperative.

EBC AND EVSC AT IVY TECH

For the second straight year, members of the EBC assisted in the presentation of forty eight brand new bicycles to the most deserving participants in the Ivy Tech Safe Schools & Healthy Students Bike Safety program. The program is sponsored by Ivy Tech in cooperation with the Evansville Vanderburgh School Corporation. The program is coordinated by Dave Schutte and EVSC school board member, Chris Kiefer.

This large contingent of EBC volunteers was quite satisfying for a weekday afternoon. Dan Armstrong, Diane Bies, Linda Clemmer, Gary Gardner, Paul Jensen, Dan and Leandra Krueger, Cindy and Corey Jones and Randy Silke all attended. During a scheduled snack time, the members introduced themselves and discussed anything about bikes with the kids.

Paul Jensen spoke about the purpose of the club, how it feels to own a new bike and a video presention and brief discussion of bicycle safety. The bicycles were awarded to students in six school districts. Presentations were made by Police Chief Brad Hill, Sheriff Eric Williams and EVSC Superintendant of Schools, Vincent Bertram. The winners were determined by their respective counselors who rate the attendance, attitude plus the behavior of each participant during his/her participation in the program.

A total of eighty-eight bicycles were awarded this year with the other forty being distributed at their on site location at an earlier date. There were approximately 240 boys and girls in attendance. Each bike included a lock and HELMET. After the bikes were awarded, the new owners wheeled their bikes to a room where the EBC members helped size the bikes, fit the helmets and answer questions about changing gears, braking and general rules of the road. The faces, expressions, and exuberance of joy of the winners was something that will be remembered by each EBC member present.

OAK LEAF TRAIL - MILWAUKEE, WI

I had the opportunity to take a vacation in late July and decided to head up to my old stomping grounds in Milwaukee, WI. My wife and I drove up, but she came back to work while I stayed behind with my bike.

Formerly known as the 76 Bike Trail, it consists of a loop around Milwaukee County with a number of trails that break off from it. In total, the path consists of 108 miles of combined asphalt paths, parkway roads and municipal streets with marked bike lanes. Milwaukee County has one of the largest county park systems in the country. Anytime you are riding on a street is to connect you with the next park area.

The large loop has a cut across path that divides it into two smaller loops. This was the first time that I had been on these paths in over 10 years. I had never done the full loop in

one shot, only the two smaller halves.

I planned to take the cut across to the main loop a long Lake Michigan and head north. From there, I would take the loop around and pull in a century.



Getting to the lake was a little interesting as I noticed that path markers were not placed consistently where they could be found. I came off the path a couple of times usually on city streets. I was able to get back, but only because I am from the area and knew where I could hook up with it.

After I passed the downtown area, I followed the path north along the lakefront and realized I missed a turn somewhere. Trying to backtrack, I never found the turnoff and ended up taking the path to the southernmost point of the trail. While I was angered that I had already abandoned my original plans, the northern half of the loop was always a crapshoot for me as I have always been a "southsider."

The southern loop was impressive. Since I had last rode the path, the county had created many paved paths off the roads and paths that did not have to cross through traffic. The paths usually met the roads by a bridge where the path was rerouted to go under the road.

Even though I only completed 85 miles, I loved the ride. As someone who knows the area...or most of it...I was able to navigate the paths to get where I wanted to go. Some of the paths could have used some repair with areas that have a number of weathered cracks in them.

If you decide to head up there and take the paths, I would encourage you to take a map. You can get them in the city or download it online. I'd provide the site, but that is what Google is for.

Tuesday and Wednesday Evening Rides: The Tuesday and Wednesday evening rides will be at 5:30 for the rest of the year. The goal is for the fast pack to leave at 5:30 and for all other riders to leave after them. On these nights, we often have a rather large turnout of fast riders and it would be better if they don't have to pass all the slower riders out on the route. These rides end in October, so this is really just a change for these 2 months. We will see how well this works out and then decide what to do in 2009. So, if you are a slower rider, like me, then please try to let the fast pack leave ahead of you. How fast are they? Heck, I don't know! All I ever see is a blur! But seriously, that group averages 22-27 MPH. If I start out before them at my 13-14 MPH, I'm going to be passed, even if I start 30 minutes ahead. It doesn't bother me to be passed, but it can be frightening for some riders or in certain situations. If you do find yourself being passed by them, remember to hold your line! Don't swerve and be careful if you look back (which can cause you to swerve.) You will probably hear the whirring of 50+ skinny tires spinning across the pavement shortly before they arrive.

Sunrise Century: Reminder, the Sunrise Century is actually Sept. 20th now. This was the century portion of the Clarksville Labor Day Classic ride and it has been split out to a different date.

Shuckin and Truckin Bicycle Tour: On Sept. 20, the Methodist Hospital of Union County, KY in Morganfield is sponsoring the Shukin and Truckin ride. They don't have a web site, so the registration form is available on the EBC website under the events section as a courtesy. Also, there's a link for a map next to the link for the form. SAG support will be provided by Gilles Cycling & Fitness.

Club Century: The century is earlier in the month than usual because the weekend of Sept. 20 is overbooked, and the weekend of Sept. 27 is the Pre-Pumpkin ride. That only leaves 2 weeks between centuries, so keep that in mind.

Get out there and ride — any distance at any speed. Just be sure to enjoy yourself along the way.
