Notes From The President's Corner Darlene Wefel-EBC President



Good news: The Warrick **County Commissioners** will be putting up 26 SHARE THE ROAD signs in Warrick County along routes that are frequently traveled by bicyclists. The "SHARE THE ROAD" Campaign purchased these signs. During the commissioners meeting on Monday, May 11th, I presented a proposal to the board. Charlie Martin (former EBC member, who may rejoin the ranks of the EBC) gave guidance and support along with Paul Jensen, Ann Pendley, and Gene Van Stone. The commissioners told us that we would have to furnish the 12" posts on which the signs will be mounted.

Samuel Roach, Superintendent of the Warrick

County Highway Dept., said his crew would install the signs. This will not be a priority project, and the signs will be installed as time allows. Our bike club voted to purchase the posts costing \$342. There will be approximately 10 signs in the Blue Grass Recreational Area as well as signs along Stevenson Station Road, Telephone Road, Vann Road, Roeder Road, Yankeetown Road, Tennyson Road, and Old Plank Road. As funds become available, I hope to see more.

At the May EBC club meeting, our members presented the Adventure



Scouts of the Buffalo Trace Council with 2 Trek mountain bikes that we purchased to complete their fleet for their summer program.

Bike Safety Programs are in full swing. So far this year, we have participated in/scheduled 5 events.

Last month we conducted a safety/rodeo for the Daisy Girl Scouts with 15 young girls ages 7-8. The girls watched a safety video. Their helmets were adjusted while I explained the proper positioning of the helmets and how to adjust them for a proper fit.

On April 26th, six members of the EBC went to South Terrace School in Wadesville for a Boy Scout Rodeo. It was a very windy day and at times we were chasing orange cones across the parking lot. The turnout of boy scouts was light, but the scouts and parents were enthusiastic. They appreciated us taking the time from our busy schedules to help teach bicycle safety.

July 11th we have another Boy Scout bike safety and rodeo at Stringtown School. There will be more information about this event in next month's newsletter.



Diabetes Tour de Cure — Louisville, KY May 16, 2009 By Hank Hudson



I recently rode in the Diabetes Tour de Cure ride in Louisville, KY, on Saturday May 16th. My associate from work, Eric Newman, (who got me started biking) and I decided to ride in the event several months ago.



I read about this in one of the Bicycling magazine issues. The closest Diabetes Tour de Cure ride was in Indianapolis, IN. However, this ride was at the Speedway race track, and neither of us wanted to just ride in circles for over 60 miles. With a little research, we found another ride in Louisville, KY, which was more in line with the type of ride we were wanting to do.

In order to participate in the ride, you had to raise a minimum of \$150. I raised \$155 and Eric raised \$500 for the Diabetes Association of Louisville, KY.

Eric and I drove over the Friday evening before the Saturday ride because the ride was to begin at

8:00 AM EST. We awoke the morning of the ride to see the sky full of lightning, and the rain came right behind it. We headed toward the ride start location hoping the rain would quit. We arrived with plenty of time to sign in and get our number and t-shirt for the ride. We met one of the riders for Team Type 1, Bob Schrank from Chicago, IL, who came down to represent the team for this event. If you are not familiar with Team Type 1, all the members of this team have Type 1 diabetes and travel around the country promoting how you can have diabetes and still be able to ride and compete in cycling races.

We had approximately a 30 minute delay while we waited for the storm to pass. We finally were able to start around 8:45 AM EST. There were over 135 riders signed up for the event, and I do believe most of them showed up to ride.

Once we finally started the ride, Eric and I found ourselves right next to Bob from Team Type 1. It was interesting to hear him talk about the various rides he has accomplished since joining the team. Bob told us Team Type 1 has members from Seattle, Washington, to New York. I know he was being kind to the rest of the riders because this 62 mile seemed like a walk in the park to him. He was riding quite awhile without his hands on the handlebars. It was not long after speaking with us that Bob drifted back to ride with another group. My guess was that this is what most the Team Type 1 members try to do in the Diabetes rides.

I was very thankful there were 4 SAG stops for the 62 mile ride. At each SAG, we were greeted by applauses and plenty of fruit, snacks, and drinks to replenish ourselves. After the first SAG stop we started riding with several young riders (everyone appears young to me). Two of the riders were brothers who had just completed their freshman year at WKU the day before. The rest of the guys were about the same age of my grown children. The guys were very kind to me, along with Eric, who stopped several times to allow me to catch up with them.

During this ride, we witnessed some of the most beautiful homes and country side along with some of the hilliest ter-

rain that I have ridden to date. As soon as I would recover from a major climb, we would encounter yet another one. To add insult, we missed one of the turns and had to back track around 8 extra miles.

We finally arrived back at the start and were once again greeted with applause for completing the ride and participating in the cure event. We were fed lunch, and it tasted wonderful after the long ride.

Eric and I did not stay long after we had lunch and were ready to head back to Evansville. We thanked the young riders for riding with us and wished them well.

This was the second longest ride I have been on since I joined EBC in June 2008. I can honestly say, without a doubt, it was the most challenging ride I have ever ridden but also one of the most fulfilling.

THE TRAIL JUNKIE VISITS INDIANAPOLIS By: Charlie Miller

On a Recent trip to Indianapolis, I was able to squeeze in a very pleasant bike ride on a beautiful spring day. I have to say that every Hoosier Cyclist's heart should swell with pride over their State Capital. Not only is it a beautiful city, but it is also very cyclistfriendly. Years ago, I did a lot of riding in Indianapolis and the surrounding area though not on any of the trails. On this trip, I was happy to discover Indianapolis' wonderful Greenway trail system.

My Ride began in the bustling little village of Broad Ripple, which is just north of Indianapolis. This little town defi-

nitely benefits from the two trails it services. I noticed many little shops, cafes, and pubs with full bicycle racks out in front. It is here that the Central Towpath Trail begins on its way south toward Indianapolis. Today, the Towpath and Canal probably look much like it did a century and a half ago when it was used to transport goods in canal boats. I could easily imagine seeing a draft horse using the towpath to pull a barge up the canal. The trail itself is a narrow, hard packed dirt trail. But I had no trouble riding my road bike upon its five-mile length. It is a very scenic trail with a woodland feel that makes it

hard to believe it is only a few miles north of a major metropolitan city. On the day I rode, the Red Bud Trees were all in bloom, and their reflection in the canal was a work of art only God can create. Along the trail, there are several wonderful bridges. One of them gives access to the Indianapolis Art Museum and Gardens that are just across the canal from the Central Towpath trail.

The Central Towpath ended at 30th Street where I picked up the White River Wapahani trail. Wapahani is the Native American name for the White

River, which this five-mile paved trail follows into Indianapolis. The trail ends at White River State Park. Most of the areas along this trail's length looked like parkland. Wildlife abounds in the White River watershed with deer, blue heron, eagles, and osprey making it their home. For those who like to play in the water, the White River is a great place to Kayak and Canoe.

As I rode my bike on the walkway, enjoying the canal and passing the fountains, I got the feeling they would offer a refreshing coolness, even on the hottest summer days.



The Monon is a 10 mile paved trail that follows the path of the now defunct Monon Railroad line.

In its hay-day, the Monon Railroad had service to every major university town in Indiana. The Railroad felt this service was so important that they painted their trains in the school colors of the universities they serviced.



Several wood ducks were enjoying the canal system this day as well as a couple hardy souls out in paddleboats.

Once through White River State Park. I entered the Downtown Canal Walk area. Indianapolis has a wonderful waterway canal system that winds through part of the city. The canal features many fountains both in the waterway and



After exiting the Downtown Canal area, I road a few short blocks across town to pick up the Monon Trail for the return trip to my starting point.





old railroad bridges on the Monon Trail are painted Indiana University red.

This trail is not very scenic as most of it runs through urban areas, but many of the building walls that shoulder the trail have been painted and

creating an urban art canyon. The Monon also passed right by the Indiana State Fairgrounds. Bike riders, skaters, joggers, and walkers heavily use this trail, and it got very congested the closer I got to Broad Ripple. But before I ended my ride, I took a side trip on the Fall Creek Trail that feeds off the Monon about a mile shy of Broad Ripple. This is a lovely wooded wetland trail that follows Fall Creek for about five miles until it comes to Skiles Park. I rode the trail into the park, but it soon began a steep incline. About halfway up the hill, I came upon a couple of other riders at a rest point. I asked how much further the trail went on and was told it ended at the top of the hill. I didn't see much joy in struggling all the way to the top just to find the trail's end, so I turned around there and headed back to the Monon. From the junction point of the Monon and Fall Creek trails, it was only a short ride back into Broad Ripple. I capped off my 35-mile trail ride at one of Broad Ripple's fine eateries,

Hogshead Barbecue, where I endecorated with colorful murals joyed a half rack of ribs and a cold beer on their outdoor verandah. Anyone interested in learning more about the Indianapolis Greenway trail system can visit www.indygreenways.org
