They find alternate forms of transportation and recreation a larger part of the consideration in relocating than in the past. Look at Indianapolis with its recently developed network of trails beginning with the North/South Monon trail. Indianapolis is now filling in the spokes from both east and west of the city. Medium sized cities such as Fort Wayne, IN, and Columbia, MO, have followed suit and are considered showrooms for such initiatives. Cycling the sand dunes of the Outer Bank

The dark and cold of January can get a person thinking about warmth and being outside and cycling without four layers on the feet. But where to go? Since my wife had always wanted to see the North Carolina Outer Banks, and likes cycling as a way to visit an area, we decided to check out the barrier islands.

Getting a destination in mind, we needed to think about when to go, where to stay, whether to take bicycles or rent. We knew we were not interested in camping, so there is the question of where to stay. How far can we go in one day? What about equipment breakdown? More and more details needed to be settled.

We were wanting a vacation, but all this getting ready, with the uncertainty about the routes and the accommodations, seemed to offer a fair degree of unsettling uncertainty, which had the possibility of taking all the fun out of the trip. So, we made a decision to look for a bicycle tour company. Looking around the internet and Adventure Cycling Magazine advertisements for bicycling vacations, we found the ad for Carolina Tailwinds (www.carolinatailwinds.com) and gave them a call. This established company (turns out they are in their eleventh year of operation) offered several tours which looked like a fit to our abilities and also to our schedule. So, back in the chilly days of January, we made a reservation for their Ocracoke

Tour in mid-May.

We just got back and had a great time, but the frugal person might wonder, "why bother to use a bicycling touring company to ride a bike on public roads?"

Simplicity. All we had to do was get there.

Greg and Anne, the owners of Carolina Tailwinds who took turns being the guide on the bike or the guide in the van, took care of all the rest. This is a couple who have made it their business to offer their customers a vacation based on bicycling. They provided rooms in nice places, meals at good restaurants, routes with interesting features, and the reassurance of being there with tools and help for any breakdown. Flat tire? Guide will fix it from the supplies in the van. Tired? Call the van and get a ride. Done for the day? Quit and ride back to the inn. Going with a guided tour truly makes it a vacation with the days open to cycle and explore.

Our tour started in Beaufort ("Bowfort"), North Carolina. We opted to rent bicycles, but there is no rule that says you can't bring your own bicycle. After being fitted to the rental bikes, our group toured Beaufort for a leisurely hour or so. We saw the closed fish processing plant, the waterfront, the oldest home, and the cemetery with the girl buried in a rum keg! Our guides

pointed out other interest places to look into later, like the Maritime Museum. Then, our group adjourned for a bit, reconvening later for a wine (beer available) and cheese happy hour with introductory lecture at the Inn followed by walking down the block for dinner together at a restaurant known for its good food. While we might have gone there to eat on our own, it is this knowledge of the region gained from experience, which the tour company has acquired from learning the area over their years of doing the tour, that added the value, confirming that going with a tour company had been the right decision.

Sunday dinner also gave us time to meet our fellow tour members. Considering a tour, we had been a bit concerned about the rest of the group. Would they be into intense, pace line cycling, or relaxed? But it turned out that we were an easily compatible lot, even more compatible after some wine, beer, and cheese!

Monday was a full first day of cycling, starting with a catered breakfast, a short hop in the van to avoid the busy single highway into Beaufort, and a choice of 36, 42, or 47 miles of cycling through a rural area with seashore views. The 36 mile route was straight to the ferry ride to Ocracoke with the other miles being side trips or extras. The highest point was the bridge over the marsh.

After a couple of hours on the ferry, during which we ate our lunch (Marvelous chocolate tort/peanut butter cake) we arrived at the village of Ocracoke. Options upon arrival included cycling around the village or riding the van to the hotel, but we chose the van because of rain. More adventurous, drip-dry people might have gone off to look at the lighthouse, but we concentrated on the wine and cheese indoors! We stayed at "The Castle," a bed and breakfast in an interesting building, both historically and structurally, right across the street from the harbor/Silver Lake. This was our base for the next couple of days.



The second day of cycling took us the length of the sand dune which is Ocracoke island. This is the definition of flat cycling, but for those who live for the challenging ride, remember that on a sand dune there is nothing to block the wind. That segment definitely proved the tour's namesake: Carolina Tailwind. The next leg was another, shorter ferry ride to Hatteras Island, where we rode to the Hatteras Lighthouse. The lighthouse is famous for being moved 2900 feet to escape the encroaching seashore. This is where we got our catered lunch. After climbing the 268 steps to check the view, we had a choice to cycle back to the ferry or ride the van. Remember the tailwind? It was now a 20 mph headwind! That challenged me on the ride back to the ferry, but others on the tour took the van. I finished the day getting about 56 miles total by overcoming the headwind to get back to The Castle.

The next morning started with an optional kayaking tour of the Pamlico Sound, which all our groups members opted to take. Our kayaking guide, Bob, an Ocracoke long-term resident who looked like a stereotypical California surfer, showed us eel grass, helped us catch a few small shrimp, told us about oysters, and shared interesting history about Ocracoke. Quick clean-up, nice breakfast, and back on the ferry for the trip back

to Cedar Island ferry. After another catered lunch on the ferry, we returned to mainland for a 32 mile ride back toward Beaufort, this time traveling through a couple of small seaside villages. Our highlight for this segment: finding pitcher plants (a carnivorous plant native to North Carolina) along the roadside. This particularly points out why bicycling as a form of travel/exploration has value over driving 55 mph between stops: you can see things at bicycle speed!

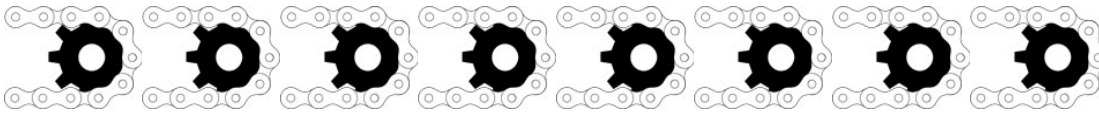
Back at Beaufort, we had the option to stay again at the Inlet Inn, but we decided to take advantage of the offered opportunity to shower and begin our trip home.

Our decision in January to do a bicycling vacation in North Carolina turned out to be just what we wanted. We got time away from home and work, a chance to visit a new part of the country, and made new friends. We



will be looking at their catalog over the next few months to consider other tours with them, but it will be hard to beat cycling the sand dunes!
