Carson's big adventure

EBC Youth Cyclist Carson Brindle pondered, "How can I get Mom and Dad to let me spend more time with Grandma? I know ... I'll just ship them off to Europe for a couple of weeks for the Tour De France!" This is their story ... PART DEUX!

What do a taxi ride, plane flight, 2 trains, and a rental car have in common? We used all these forms of transportation in a 12 hour day of travel to get from Prague to Alpe d'Huez! Throw in rush hour traffic in Grenoble when we got our rental car and we were exhausted by the time we made it to our hotel, Le Castillan. But it was 6 o'clock on Friday and we still needed to head back down 21 switch backs to the town of Le Bourg d'Oisans to pick up my bike rental so I could get a full day of riding in on Saturday. Benoist, owner of Bleach bike rentals, with his broken English helped me get an O'rka (French brand) carbon road bike setup for the next two days. They offer TCR Giants as well, but I wasn't specific on my Google translated email conversation and they were all reserved by the time I got there.

Day 1, we woke up a little late and ate breakfast at the hotel. Le Castillan is directly on the famed Alpe d'Huez climb 100 meters in front of the last of the 21 switch backs to the top. It is a nice family owned ski resort hotel that I would recommend if you ever get a chance to ride here. We wandered down to the tourist office to get a couple touring guide books. They offer over 30 MTB and 30 road routes for all ages and ability of riders. If you're not traveling in a group this is a must stop for the first time biker to the region. Visit their web site at www.bike-oisans.com for more information. The guides give you distances and difficulty ratings based on elevations and gradients. On top of this the maps show parking locations and possible rest stops.

My plan on this first day was to venture down the mountain, take in



some of the scenery and local flavor and of course see how my time matched up with the greats on the epic 21 switch back beast called Alpe d'Huez. I chose the Villard Reculas route from the tourism bike guide for this adventure. It is a 47km route on good to average roads with an elevation gain of 1280 meters, and maximum gradient of 12%. It takes you down a very narrow but well paved road off the north face of Alpe d'Huez through the town of Villard-Reculas,

swings you back through the town of Le Bourg d'Oisans and then you finish with the 14km climb back up Alpe d'Huez.

Heading into Villard-Reculas I had to stop for a picture of the switch backs up the mountain that takes your breath away. The descent off the north face was breezy and cold, I was thankful for the vest and arm warms I almost decided to leave at the hotel room. Once making it to the bottom you meander along N91 which although is a major motor car thorough fare, in this bike friendly region you had safe riding in marked bike lanes. Once in Le Bourg d'Oisans I wandered through the town and visited a farmers market which brought in hundreds of people from the surrounding area.

Then came the time for the true reason for this day—one left hand



turn off N91 onto D211 which is your ticket up Alpe d'Huez. This is a 14km climb at an average grade of 10%. The grade kicks literally from the first couple pedal strokes.

Wide, well paved roads with bikers, cars, and motorcyclists were all in a constant stream moving up and down the mountain. I made it



to the top in 65 minutes, that's just 28 minutes shy of the record of 37 minutes set by Marco Pantani in

the 97 Tour, Ha!

After getting back to the hotel Sonya and I drove down to Bourg d'Osians for a late lunch. We made it back to the hotel in time for one more attempt to beat Pantani's record. It didn't happen, of course, but I did improve on my previous time by over 5 minutes by coming in just under 60 minutes this

time. Don't tell my team mates, but I switched into the granny gear 34x25 and spun my butt as fast as I could to the top. Forgive me for not wearing a helmet uphill but it was a rental and I wasn't too eager to mix sweat with hundreds of other previous renters who wore it and the fact I was averaging somewhere about 7mph, I told Skip when

he saw the pictures, it was just "so Euro."

Day 2, was the epic day. My goal was to ride Stage 19 of this year's Tour. Well almost—I started in Saint Michel and had to stop at the Col du Lautaret. This route would take you over 2 other famous mountain climbs of the tour. Col

du Telegraphe and the famed Col du Galibier. At 2645 meters it was the highest mountain top finish the Tour had ever seen on Stage 18 of this year's rendition.

It started with a 2 hour drive out to Saint Michel. I hopped

out and Sonya drove SAG support for the journey back. The first mountain to conquer was Col du

Telegraphe at an elevation of 1566 meters. This is roughly a 12km climb with average grade of 8%. The newly paved blacktop roads take you through what looks like a forest up and over Telegraphe and then a short decent into the town of Valloire, most noted on the tour for its towering straw people.

Sonya stopped several times up Telegraphe to take pictures and at one point



stopped to talk with a French woman sagging for her husband. It all about went south when the rental Sonya was driving almost rolled back into the French woman's RV when leaving, but luckily it missed by millimeters.

The car drove like a golf cart in that it shut

off every time you stopped, which made it interesting on the steep ascents to get going every time you'd stop. Sagging for this ride was made a bit more "ex-



citing" by the number of motorcycle enthusiasts who come to these mountains to test their driving skills each weekend.

They are fast, agile and out-number

the cars by far. After a while, you eventually "get over" being passed all the time by the motorcyclists and just do your best to watch out for the cyclists and drive the technical routes through the mountains.

Once through Valloire I started another 19km climb to the top of Galibier. This was the toughest ride I can recall since I started riding in the late 80's. Not only was it steep but it was void of any natural or manmade wind blocks. While riding with the wind, I would heat up like an inferno, but make a switch back and come back against it and immediately be chilled to the 40 degree

temperature it was at this elevation. The roads were marked every kilometer with a small stone pillar telling you how much further to the top and what the gradient was to come.

I'm not sure if this is to encourage you to the top or to put fear in you! (These pillars, however, are a wonderful way to communicate food/water stops with your SAG driver!) 1km to the top there is a tunnel you can pass through by car.

This is because only tourists and raving lunatics on bikes would suffer up the last narrow steep road with no guard rails. Sonya said it was like driving into the clouds because when the road turned, it was too steep to see where you were going—all that you could see was the clouds in front of your windshield! After the picture ops at the top was the jour-

ney down Galibier. I put on every piece of clothing I brought. I reached steady speeds of 35 to 40 mph, and I was taking it easy down this mountain! There would be no trip to the hospital if you smoked a turn—there would be a search party to find your body!!! I was passed the whole way down by local bike teams who looked to be making a day trainer out of this climb.

Once down on the Col du Lautaret, I had to end my journey. The road from here to Bourg d'Oisans is littered with narrow tunnels and with the traffic of the day would have been unsafe to ride.

Over the 2 days I gathered in a little over 100 miles of biking through some of the most storied roads of the Tour. This was truly a weekend to remember.
