



Our monthly club meeting is on the second Thursday of every month except FEBRUARY at the Pizza Chef in Newburgh Indiana at 6:30 PM.


Evansville Bicycle Club, Inc. Mission Statement

GPM History

t was 1981. People all across the country were getting into fitness. The craze had permeated every nook and cranny of the '80s pop culture. From Olivia Newton-John's "Let's Get Physical" h September to Nike's slogan "Just Do It!" in July, 1988. People were getting fit, jazzercising, and riding bikes.

Zoom the map to Evansville.

It was middle of the summer, I think, when

Dr. Warren Hankins and Dr. Mell Welborn approached Dave Yeley, I and a few other club members

about putting on a "Fitness Festival," to be sponsored by Welborn Hospital and hosted by The Evansville Bicycle Club. The memories of all the planning, research and eventually putting on the festival—including a bike ride—are somewhat faint. We had fitness meetings, seminars, and a huge bike ride which began at Central High School

on First Avenue. It serpentined around the northern part of Evansville and back to the school.

Fast-forward to 2013.

Lycra has replaced blue jean shorts and t-shirts; helmets have replaced baseball caps and bare heads; carbon fiber and lightweight aluminum now stand alongside steel; 10-speeds have given way to 20 and even 30-speeds.

When Welborn Hospital decided to drop from their sponsorship, and the EBC decided to do it on their own, the ride became what it is known today: "The Great Pumpkin Metric." (And, of course, with apologies to Charles Schulz and Charlie Brown.)

This year commemorates the 32^{nd} annual edition of our beloved metric. Ride chairmen have changed over the years, from Dave, to Keith to Darlene (and a few others in between).

But the fact remains: it's one "helluva" ride!

So, with that said, this letter is to encourage all of you to either volunteer your services or register and ride! If you're riding, bring a friend or two, or more. Get a "team" together--WE ENCOURAGE FIVE OR MORE! Each team will receive a plaque with the name of the team plus the total number of miles ridden by the team. 
