Welcome to The month of May, National Bicycle Month with the week of May 12-18 as National Bicycle week. The City of Evansville and the local surrounding area is going to celebrate the week in grand fashion.

Mayor of Evansville **Lloyd Winnecke** scheduled to participate in **Ride of Silence**.

The International 10<sup>th</sup> **Ride of Silence** and the fifth in Evansville will be on Wednesday, May 15<sup>th</sup>. The ride will begin and end at the State Hospital Grounds. Riders will ride in relative silence to pay tribute to those persons who have died or have been injured as the result of an automobile-bicycle encounter on public roadways. The ride begins at 6:00 p.m. and will travel downtown passing the Ford Center and then return. The ride is a bit over eight miles and takes about one hour; hence an 8mph pace. Last year found five families participating with one young lady riding her bike with training wheels. The event is escorted by two of Evansville's finest Police officers.

Historically there was a ride in 2009, but no details are available. In 2010 The Evansville Bicycle Club and the Evansville Area Trails Coalition took over the administration of the ride and drew 24 riders. In 2012 the event attracted over 80 participants. Please come and join us to pay tribute.

Nationally, as well as locally, Friday, May 17 is declared as **Bike to Work Day**.

Let's hope Friday May, 17<sup>th</sup> is a pleasant one as all those commuting to their place of employment will be encouraged to do so by bicycle. In the U.S the average commuter population has risen 47% since 2000 and in some communities up 435% (Lexington, KY). The city with the highest percentage is Portland, OR with 6.3% of the commuting population going the two wheeled mode on a regular basis. The 6<sup>th</sup> annual "Wurst" Ride will be held on Sat. May 18,

at the top of Nurrenbern Hill at Burdette Park. This is all **FREE**. Bonuses include Free food, drinks **PLUS** giveaways by Dan's Comp. Routes range from 6 miles to 36 miles.

After riding the "Wurst" EBC volunteers will be heading a bit north to host the third annual bike fair at Marrs Hill School.

And to finish off this busy week, on Sunday, May 19<sup>th</sup> **Streets Alive** will commence on Fulton Avenue from 1:00-4:00 p.m. This is a **FREE** event and encourages active participation in many different physical events. Related to bicycling will be a unicycle demonstration, an olde time bicycle, you know the kind with the giant wheel in the front and the tiny wheel in the back. **The Dan's Comp BMX Stunt Team** will put on an exhibition of X games stunts that you "don't want to try at home". Plus a three wheel slider demonstration. Don't know what a **Slider** is, come out and see for yourself!

The latest word on a trail from Sunrise park to Angel Mounds. The University of Evansville of Civil Engineer senior class project was presented on Friday April 26 and the result was a complete plan which included the how, why, what, when and how much. With plenty of volunteer help and financial assistance we could be riding to and from Angel Mounds by the middle of 2014.

The last word for this month is there is a rumor circulating that a purchase of six acres of land was completed at the Blue Grass center where the four routes meet. A plan is in place to make available for a thirty car parking lot. The time line for completion of this project is the end of May. That opens up a whole slew of new riding routes. Stay tuned!

### **RIDE YOUR BIKE TO WORK WEEK May 13 to May 19 is RIDE YOUR BIKE TO WORK WEEK**

**May 15<sup>th</sup> - Ride of Silence, 6:00 PM** This is an awesome short ride starting at the State Hospital grounds and touring approximately 12 miles through downtown Evansville. This ride is done in total silence and participants are encouraged to think about, and dedicate the ride to those cyclists who have been injured or killed in cycling accidents in the past year. This is a family friendly, slow paced ride in which everyone stays in a group on the ride. It starts at 6 PM and takes around an hour. Bring your friends! Once we start riding... SHHH! No talking!!

**May 18<sup>th</sup> - The 7<sup>th</sup> Annual Free Wurst Ride 9:30 AM** in Evansville. This is a free ride offered at Burdette Park. Enjoy the ride and a bratwurst and other food and drinks after the ride. Ride as little or as long as you want, 6 to 37 miles.
