

# ONE POINT FOR CYCLISTS

As many of you know my son Alex lives in Eugene, Oregon. I had an opportunity to visit with him and his family at the end of my ride to the west coast this summer. Then I went back out a few weeks later because he asked me to be available as support for him in a court hearing about an incident where he was hit by a truck while riding his bicycle almost three years ago.

He was riding home from school/work one afternoon in October 2011. As he came down a gentle hill with the right of way to him he saw a truck to his left rolling through a stop sign too late for him to stop. His bike was destroyed, his leg, ankle, and back were injured but more frighteningly he had a concussion.

Sadly when it happened he was in such shock that he kept saying he was okay. The guy who hit him was very nice, admitted fault at the scene, gave Alex his insurance info and business card and left. No police were called, no ambulance, before the guy left. Thank goodness Alex called me to tell me he was "okay" and I insisted he call 911. They sent a fire truck as he describes it, probably an EMT truck. But again he said he was okay so they did not take him in.

While whomever responded to his 911 call was there, an eye witness came forward to say she saw it all and gave them her name. Alex, still refusing help, limped to a bike shop with his broken bike as a crutch to ask what to do about his bike. They encouraged him to call for a ride and his now wife picked him up.

She took him to the ER where it was determined he had a concussion. She stayed over and took care of him as he was still not okay even though he continued to report to me and her that he was. After a year of physical therapy and a memory training class to retrain his brain due to struggles he was having with grad school functions (he essentially could not complete classes), he found out the guy had changed his tune or at least the insurance company had changed the tune.

Now they were saying Alex should have been able to stop and so he was at fault for riding where he had the right of way had he been a car. They even refused to pay all of his medical bills.

When the time had about run out on the case Alex hired an attorney to fight for his rights as a cyclist. The insurance attorney tried to convince the jury that Alex should have made eye contact with the driver before entering the intersection and since he didn't he had failed to exercise enough care. He also charged that going 25 mph in a 25 mph speed zone was too fast for Alex to be able to control his bike and that contributed to the accident. The most upsetting to me was that the driver tried to say Alex was riding on the wrong side of the road.

Alex knows the rules of the road. He was on the right side of the roadway, he did have on his helmet which served to save his brain from further injury, and he did a great job controlling his bike and being aware of the car as he approached the intersection even though he had too much faith that the guy was going to stop eventually. The witness did testify in the case. I was allowed to testify as to the report Alex gave me of the accident at the scene while he was in shock after it happened, he has no memory of it now due to the PTSD symptoms of the concussion.

In spite of all these positive things, after two days in court I still sweated for over an hour today with him and his attorney while the jury decided the fault in the accident. I was so delighted when all 12 jurors, it was reported, agreed that Alex had zero fault and the truck driver had 100% fault in the accident.

What an accomplishment for cyclists in Eugene!!

However I am still saddened to see a white bicycle chained somewhere in Eugene (there are several I've noticed that have been there a while) because I know someone wasn't as lucky as my son. Thank God he is going to be okay and will hopefully finish his studies and be successful someday.

Let us all continue the battle for rights for cyclists and remember to always wear a helmet and watch out for the other guy!

# 2014 Fall Ride: The Silver Comet • October 18 - 19



Silver Comet ride with the Fuller Center Bicycle Adventure
Saturday, October 18 and Sunday Oct. 19 at 8:00am in EDT • 4342 Floyd Road, Mableton, GA

This family-friendly two-day weekend ride on a smoothly paved Rail-to-Trail is perfect for new and experienced riders alike with its flat terrain and no traffic! The trail takes you through beautiful secluded forests and rural landscapes just when the leaves should be beginning to change. It's gorgeous and a cyclist's dream.

The ride starts and finishes in Mableton, Georgia (near Atlanta) and goes to the Alabama state line and beyond. In Alabama the trail name changes to the Chief Ladiga Trail. Those joining for both days will camp at the lovely Chief Ladiga Campground about 7 miles past the state line.

We're offering a 1-day and a 2-day option. The 1-day option lets you bike a total of 32 miles on the trail, finishing where you started. The 2-day option lets riders choose for the first day whether to go 64 or 101 miles (a metric century or a century ride!), and the second day all will bike the 64 miles back to your car at the starting point.

The ride will be well-supported. Numerous old train depots have been converted into quaint welcome centers all along the route who love to see cyclists coming through. We'll be providing numerous snack stops as described below and we'll even have a support vehicle that could meet you at the nearest intersection for emergency pick-up in a real crunch.

One important final note: We believe in community on our rides. Expect to get to know one another and make new friends! We'll also share more about the work of the Fuller Center and a brief devotion on Sunday morning.
