

### On a more serious note:

There are so many opportunities to ride this month. I hope you will partake of some or many! We kick the month off with the Harmony 100 which is happening on May 2 and 3 this year. It is always a great ride with beautiful scenery and good times. Then the next weekend May 9 is the Rockin River City Ride sponsored by the Junior League of Evansville. # UNPLUGGED

Hi! I am "Pill" Bill Voegel. Perhaps I should clear this up. My nickname is not because I take a lot of pills. It is to differentiate between "Hill" Bill Johnson, "Major" Bill Majors, and myself. I have been a bike rider all my adult life, but very casual at best until 2009. I have ridden the Hilly Hundred for 25 of the last 26 years, but until 2009 I would get my bike

off the wall in August, ride a couple of hundred miles including the Hilly, then hang it back up. I credit Cindy Jones for getting me to take biking seriously and join the club. She noticed my "Hilly" t-shirt at the YMCA and talked to me about her spin class and about EBC. I became a regular at her class and took her up on her invitation to ride a club ride. The rest, as the say, is history.

Like most kids I rode bikes growing up, but only as a means

to get somewhere. As the youngest of three brothers, I was in high school before I got my own bike. It was a Schwinn 5 speed. Yellow with chrome fenders. Mom and Dad bought it for me at Gilles when they had a store on West Columbia in Evansville. At Purdue (Pharmacy 1976), Kathy and I had matching Schwinn LeTour bikes, also yellow. Over the years I have progressed through various Trek, Nishiki, Raleigh, Serotta, and now Cervelo bikes. I have particularly fond memories of my blue Trek 600 series I bought from Small's Bicycle World on Morgan Avenue. This was when Trek road bikes were 400, 500, and 600 series. This was my first bike that almost anyone would consider to be quality, light and FAST with aluminum frame, short wheelbase and great components. I rode that bike for almost 20 years! I finally gave it away to someone in my spin class at the YMCA.

I strictly ride road bikes (Although I have been

promising Ron Pendley for 2 years that I will go mountain biking with him!) From 2009 through 2012 I was all about the miles, building up to a 12,000 mile year in 2012. I mainly have Diane Bies to thank for that. She and I rode MANY thousands of miles together, and still look forward to riding together. In 2013 I evolved (or devolved depending on how you look at it) into trying to become faster. My main impetus for this was qualifying for the Senior Games and wanting to compete at the National Senior Games in the summer of 2013. I got a nutritionist to help me understand that Snickers is not, in fact, a health food, and I started personal training with Diana Holland at Bob's gym. With their help I

went from 199 pounds to my current 169 pounds. My bike training partner, Colette Loehrlein, and I are working hard at interval training to get ready for this summer's National Games in Minnesota.

In EBC I have been the Membership Chairman for the last

few years. I try to help out marking routes and have driven a SAG wagon at the GPM the last 4 years. My miles have diminished since 2013 in favor of trying to get faster, but I still make it to quite a few rides. My favorite club ride is the Olmstead 22 and my favorite club century is Santa Claus. My favorite out of town ride has to be the Hilly Hundred.

When not biking I can usually be found in my woodworking shop building anything from picture frames to entertainment centers. I especially like

woodworking because when I am done building, I get to



turn the project over to my wife Kathy for putting on the finish. Kathy and I raised Golden Retrievers for 35 years and now our Shih Tzu "Snickers" and our beagle "Ruby" are our honorary Goldens.

Other than my marriage of 40 years (in August) my membership in EBC has been one of the best things that ever happened to me. I have made so many wonderful friends in EBC and I will remember my experiences forever. From our advocacy programs like bike rodeos, to helping put on the GPM, to informal birthday parties at Olmstead parking after a ride, I truly cherish being a part of this great organization.

### DIRECTIONS:

From I64 take Exit 25 traveling south on US 41. Drive 11.8 miles, take the ramp to IN-66 W/ Diamond Ave. Turn right onto east Diamond Ave. Drive 1.2 miles, turn left onto north Heidelbach Ave. Drive .3 miles. Again this year, we will not be using the baseball stadium parking lot so look for signs and volunteers indicating River City Bicycle Classic parking.

### **GUIDELINES:**

This race is held under USA Cycling Event Permit (permit pending). All USA Cycling rules apply. Helmets required. Must be present to receive prizes/awards. Race held rain or shine. No refunds. Must present a valid 2015 USA Cycling license at registration. \$15.00 one-day licenses will be available for Cat 5 men, Cat 4 women and Citizen's race only. The River City Bicycle Classic is part of the INKY Point Series presented by Indiana Kentucky Cycling Association. For more information, go to **inkycycling.com**.

### COURSE:

This road criterium racecourse is a fast .7-mile loop around the lake in historic Garvin Park. The wide-open course features several turns that are ideal for racing and spectating. Course is closed to traffic.

Tin Man Brewery's Beer Garden and The North Youth Baseball League Food Booth will be available again this year. Both will be located near the start/finish.

# Who You Gonna Call?!

This was a question that my husband Tony and I had to ask when our friend Ioan Baehl had a fatal accident while on a club ride. As the ambulance took Joan to the hospital we only knew of 1 person to call, her close friend Nancy and neither of us had her phone number. I had to make several phone calls in hopes that someone knew Nancy's number or a relative of Ioan's. This starts a chain of events with questions, phone calls, miss information and so on.

I have gotten to know the people I mostly ride with yet I know very little about them and them me. Tony and I are usually together on the ride but not always. This got me to thinking. Most of us carry a cell phone and a good percent are secured with a passcode leaving it impossible to obtain any emergency contact information. I brought my concerns up at the April club meeting and mentioned that when I was training for the YMCA half marathon we had to have our emergency contact information written on the insole of our right shoe or an information tag attached to the shoe laces. Therewas a lot of valuable input and great suggestions however we could not come up with that one perfect solution for everyone.

I also feel that it is up to the individual on weather or not they choose to carry their emergency contact information.

I would like to make everyone aware of the multitude of option they have and hope you<sup>[2]</sup> choose to carry this information. There are several free smart phone apps like Road ID, Medical ID, Emergency ID, and ID life that will appear on your phone screen as soon as you power up without having to use you passcode to access. These are great if you have a medical condition since you can list all medicals and other vital information. Other great Medical and emergency ID options are the ID arm bands, shoe tags, bike tags and ID plates for your helmet. Diane, Tony and I got the arm band thru Road ID and they were inexpensive. If you down load the Road ID app to you phone you should get a 10% discount on any purchase. YikesID.com offers a nice selection of cyclist arm bands, tags and ID plates.
