From Sea to Shining Sea

Adventures of the captain and stoker on three coasts (continued from December Newsletter)

California Coast

With the appetizers nearly over, captain and stoker set off for the main course. Charley the RV took us through Paxico KS (est. 1866), home of the soon to be famous (but sadly just missed) Meat Loaf Festival, and on to the cycling mecca of Boulder CO. The countryside north of Boulder is full of country roads and cyclists taking advantage of them.

While the stoker had been to CA only twice the captain lived there for 20 years, so it was time to pick off a few classic rides. First up was Lake Tahoe, elev. 6,000 ft. and a stunning 72 mile loop,

though we chose to ride an out and back along part of the shoreline and avoid the South Shore traffic and casinos.

Next was Napa Valley, more particularly the Silverado Trail, which parallels the much busier and not recommended Hwy 29. The riding was relatively flat through vineyards small and large that are edging their way up the slopes of the surrounding golden hills.

The wine tasting used to be free, but hey, how often do we do this? And not even a credit against a purchase. Mindful of traffic we stopped at one winery only, Mumm, and quaffed some highly rated sparkling wines.

Then it was on to the Pacific Coast. The captain was armed with the Adventure Cycling route maps and the excellent guidebook on the route, 1999 edition but updated several times since. Both are essential reading: the maps provide details on mileage and profiles, the guidebook on campsites and side trips. Both are geared for a continuous, self-supported push from north to south, the (highly) recommended approach. A couple of things became clear from the maps and guidebook: first, there were large sections of busy freeway riding; and second,

there were large sections of winding, narrow roads with no shoulder, mostly over mountains, with up to 1,500 ft. climbs. Neither of these appealed to the captain or stoker, so rides were picked to avoid those sections.



N. Calif beaches are huge and largely deserted, and the water is icy.

The first Pacific Coast ride took us north from Crescent City to the Oregon border, pretty much to document the start of our southbound odyssey. The route was gentle (gotta love those maps) and scenery spectacular, notably Smith River and the Easter Lilly fields (they grow some unusual and not always legal things in California, particularly Humboldt County). This is the Redwood Empire, and though much of the area has been logged, old growth redwoods are protected in several State and National Parks. Both stoker and captain are unabashed tree-huggers; this is what we

came to see: trees up to 2,000 years old, over 300 ft. high and over 20 ft. diameter. God's hand never wrought more beauty than this. We came across the local herd of Roosevelt Elk, just grazing beside the road, and felt like intruders.

The plan included a ride along the Lost Coast, but the road out

of Ferndale was not passable and we moved on to the Avenue of the Giants in Humboldt Redwoods State Park. The road through the Avenue parallels the Eel River and is gently rolling, no shoulder but little traffic mid-week in September.

The magnificent, soaring trees create a natural cathedral, the grandeur is humbling. What a place to ride! Notes for September 10 read: "Off on the bike at 9ish, 60 F, patchy fog. Rode 4 miles to Mendocino, round the headlands and back, only 13 miles but no appetite for traffic on Hwy 1". Mendocino is another thriving art town and tourist destination modeled after the New England fishing villages we rode through in Maine. It is still a serious fishing port, harvesting succulent

Dungeness crab. Further south, in Bodega Bay (where Alfred Hitchcock's *The Birds* was filmed), whales were

spotted playing about a mile off-shore. After a second weekend socializing in the San Francisco Bay Area it was on to Monterey and the famed 17-Mile Drive. This loop runs along the shoreline between Monterey and Carmel, with the Pacific Ocean

on one side and world class golf courses (think Pebble Beach,

Cypress Point) and attendant multi-million dollar mansions on the other. At Carmel it turns inland and soars up into the hilly pine forests: long, steep climbs and exhilarating descents. The Garmin reported 2,500 ft. of climbing, in part due to some questionable navigating by the captain. The stoker was not amused.

The plan included a ride in Big Sur, arguably one of the most spectacular stretches of coast on the planet, but the coastal mountains plunge into the Pacific and stopping places are few and far between. Charley the RV was not welcome at several State Parks, which he regarded as blatant discrimination. So we passed Big Sur on six wheels rather than two. This segment ended at Hearst Castle at San Simeon, built by media mogul William Randolph Hearst between 1919 and 1946. The Castle, still a working ranch, was built in the Italianate style, is vast and houses the most astonishing collection of artifacts dating back to Egyptian and Roman

times. Not just furniture and artifacts, significant parts of the castle such as ceilings, walls, fireplaces, and porticos were lifted from their centuries-old European structures, brought to Hearst's specially built dock at San Simeon, modified and installed in the castle. One of the alternative routes recommended by the Pacific Coast guidebook was along the Santa Ynez Valley between Lompoc and Solvang, a charming Danish town (think pea soup and pastries) north of Santa Barbara. Lompoc is home to the Mission Purisima (short name version), one of the 21 missions established by Father Junipero Serra in the late 1700s on his march north from Mexico to

San Francisco. Each was staffed with a couple of priests and a detachment of soldiers with the intent of converting native tribes to Christianity and establishing a religious commune. The system worked well for some decades, until support from Mexico was withdrawn and the missions became self-supporting. The cultural conflicts between the native

tribes and soldiers increased and the priests were powerless to stop abusive behaviors, so most of the missions declined and were abandoned.

Two final rides awaited us. The first started in Agoura Hills, inland and north of Los Angeles and took us up Hid-

den Valley, not sure about the Ranch but we did pass Ellen DeGeneres's house. And the second started in Ranch Santa Fe, north of

was over. Next up will be the Vancouver, Oregon and Washington parts of the Pacific Coast, and a return trip to California to re-explore the Sierra Nevada (the captain says Yosemite is God's other natural cathedral) and more time in the SF Bay Area. And the take away is...we have really good riding right here in Southwest Indiana! Sure, the coast and mountains are far away, but the lack of traffic and road surfaces make for good riding, and the local company is excellent! 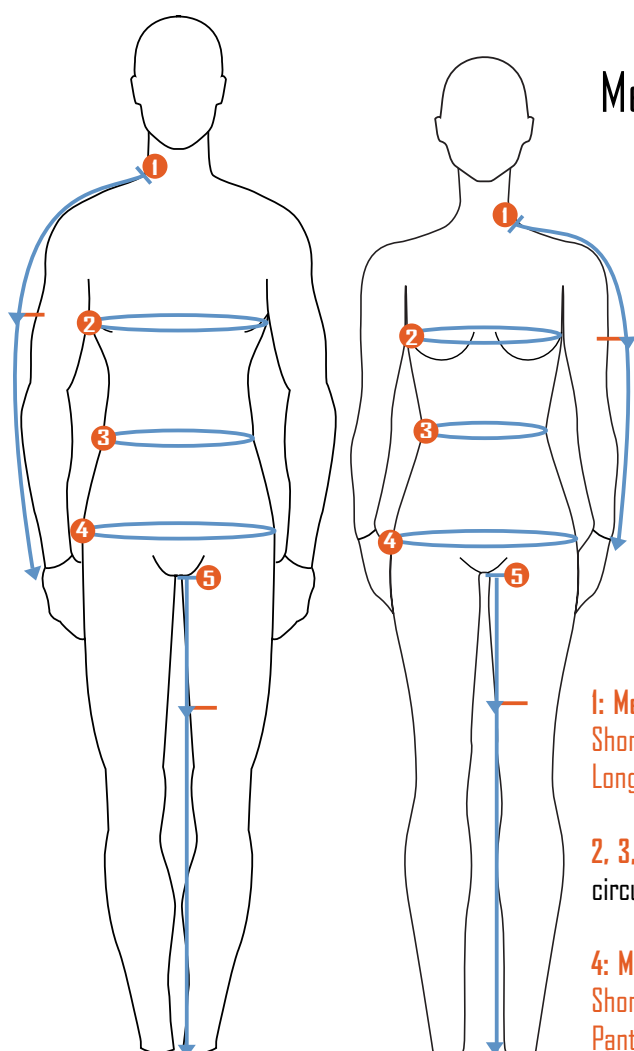

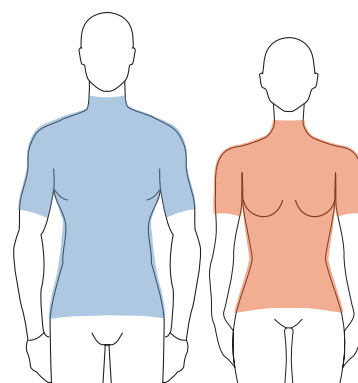

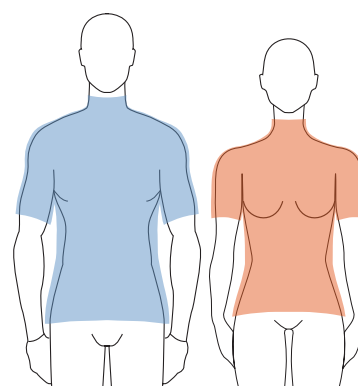
