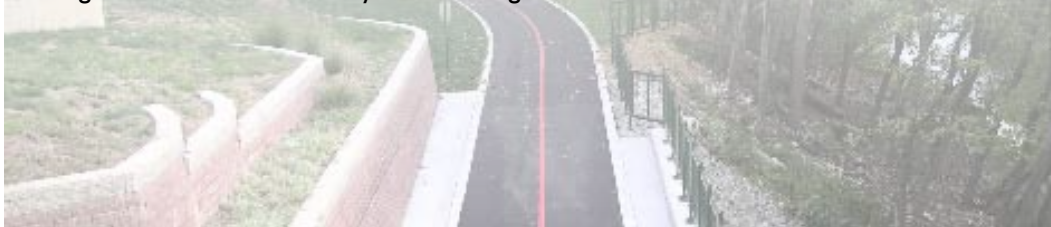

We also had a little spot on the Channel 25 news about bicycle safety after a child was hit by a car. The cyclist ran a stop sign and was hit by a driver who received a DUI for the accident. Both were at fault.

The message I would like to make in all this is that we need to be seen! After the newscast I had a call from a man who lives in Bluegrass area who is concerned about our safety. He wanted me to share with everyone that Hot Pink, High Visibility Green, Yellow, and Orange are the best colors to wear to be seen on the roadway.

All too often riders are dressed in dark clothing and blend into the surroundings. Motorists do not want to hit us, most of the time. Please think about this when you choose your bike clothes, especially if you are going out alone or at dusk or dawn. Be safe!! Be seen!!

# THEY COULD REALLY USE YOUR HELP!! (& you can feel good about yourself)

During the month of June there are two community bicycle related programs that do GREAT things, but you rarely know about them until they are over. EBC has assisted in both of these programs both with volunteers and financial assistance. Please try and find some time to volunteer to help. You DO NOT have to be a scorcher, have 30 years' experience or be a bike mechanic. JUST YOU and some of your time.

## iCanBike June 20-24

The Evansville Bicycle Club has been a part of this program for the past seven years and it is unlike any other bicycle assistance program. The Easter Seals Disability Services sponsors the program and the students involved are at least 8 years old and have mild physical or mental disabilities. The campers attend for five days and begin by riding special bikes with rear rollers replacing the back wheel and tire. By the third day many of the riders are riding a two wheeler with little or no assistance. Observers and Volunteers (you?) are amazed at the progress. Eighty percent of those that enroll are successful by the end of camp.

## Evansville and Hope Paul Jensen

Being from Minneapolis, Minnesota, I wanted to attend and watch the final radio program, A Prairie Home Companion. Most of you have no idea what that program is about so I won't bother to explain. Anyway I knew the city was into bicycling as an alternative means of transportation and has been a leader in the U.S. when I lived there 50, 60, well actually more than 70 years ago. On this trip we lodged downtown for convenience and that gave me plenty of time to observe. Spending much time outside there was not one minute beginning at 6:00 am until after 10:00 pm in five days that I did not see a bike going down one of the busiest streets in the city.

Bikers and motorists seem to co-exist at a mutually respectful level. Minneapolis has an extremely active Bike Sharing program with available bicycles every three or four blocks. It is one of the most active bicycle commuting cities in the country. And that is 12 months a year. During the winter The bike lanes & trails are plowed at the same time as the city streets. City buses have bike racks in the front. At bus stops are advertisements with the phrase "if it is too cold to bike, take the bus." Surrounding the lakes in Minneapolis are two trails, an

inner trail for walkers and runners and an outer trail for bikers and skaters, All of these trails on the lakes are connected to each other by trail. As of 2015, Minneapolis has 129 miles of on-street bikeways (Evansville has 22) and 97 miles of off-street bikeways (Evansville has 6.5). The city has also been awarded with the Gold Level Bicycle Friendly Community Award from the League of American Bicyclists. Evansville is actively seeking the Bronze Level.

The Metropolitan area of Evansville is slowly, and steadily showing progress toward becoming more bicycle savvy. The North Main bike paths separate from the street, the pedestrian/ bicycle crossing over the Lloyd near the State hospital, Warrick County currently building over 20 miles of trails. The best Streets Alive festival yet in Garvin Park, the upcoming bike race in Garvin Park. Evansville now has a pedal bar located on Franklin street (I saw five of these in downtown Minneapolis, the 35th annual Great Pumpkin Metric coming up in October. And there are several other projects in the works.

Evansville may not be Minneapolis, but I can safely say that we will be comparable SOONER than later.
