### **LANI KAI 2018**

I am reborn, in heaven, in salubrious Lanikai.

Waking at 4 am, a shower, fresh clothes, a large mug of cappuccino, a rocking chair on the deck outside my bedroom 50 feet above the road. The night was clear and black, no moon, no clouds, no wind. At that time there were no cars and no joggers, no barking dogs, only the

sound of the crickets and the surf. The waves breaking on the sand are tiny, lovely waves audible from a 120 degrees perspective, first breaking left and then right. Between the sounds of the shore waves is the constant rumble of the larger waves breaking on the more distant reef.

The Lanikai community is dotted with lights, many like those at my home, solar powered lights that line the 40 steps up a path from the street to the front door. The crowns of a pair of palm trees is at eye level from my deck and are illuminated by spot lights hidden somewhere on the ground below. In the distance,

lights twinkle from the far side of residential Kailua Bay to the Marines' base that ends on Mokapu crater.

I sit comfortably pushed back on the rocker, my feet encased in wool lined house shoes, a thick "hoodie" jacket, By Ken Herrmann

a cup of coffee and just listen to the sounds of the surf. It's a cool 65 degrees. Gradually the community greets the morning. A car drives by, a jogger runs on the bike path, a dog barks, a jet from Honolulu passes in the distance and fades away. I love listening to the sound of the surf. The waves breaking on the reef will be visible from where I sit when the sun rises. Yesterday was my first morning



in my Lanikai rental home and the morning was dark with clouds and noisy with heavy rains. I stayed in bed and listened to the rain, waking and falling back to sleep. Today I am eager to watch the sun rise. It is winter and I don't know where the sun will rise on the horizon. Possibly it will appear as a green flash, there are no clouds and no wind. My view of the ho-

rizon from the upper deck is intermittently obscured by trees and the Mokulua Islands. A jet approaches Honolulu, lights flashing and engines roaring about as loud as the distant waves on the reef.

## **LANI KAI 2018**

Another runner passes. Another car passes, perhaps the fifth car in the past hour. Gradually the cars pass more frequently and the sounds of neighbors putting out their trash signals the waking of the community.

It's my habit to practice my cello in the early morning. Today I don't want to disrupt the morning peace. I wait in the silent darkness and drink in the rare beauty of the calm winter air.

There will be better morning opportunities for practice when the tradewinds blow to obscure the sounds of the surf and of my practice. The community comes alive an hour

before the sun rises. As the sky gains light and color, the birds wake and create a symphonic wall of sound, blocking the sound of the shore break and occasionally pausing enough to allow the reef break to be heard. The sun will rise 5 minutes from now, the early morning red hues have faded and the horizon contains a band of low clouds: no green flash today. The sun rises at 7 am with glorious color on the right side of the Mokulua Islands.

I am happy.

Ride Hosts We are looking for ride hosts for the spring. It isn't too early to start planning that special ride you want to host. The weather will be warm again before we know it. (Or at least I hope it will be.)

#### EFFECTIVE MARCH 11 DAYLIGHT SAVINGS TIME IS BACK!!!

Monday evening rides at the 4-H Center are back on the calendar with Daylight Savings Time. This ride will be at 5:30 so we can finish before dark. Consider planning to stay for dinner after with the other riders. This is a great opportunity to get to know others.

Tuesday evening rides at Olmstead are also back. These are only 17 mile rides for March and will start at 5:30 also. Safety is a concern!

Wednesday night rides at Garvin Park Consider coming early if you want extra miles. You can earn up to 20 miles on these circuit rides in the park. We are staying in the park due to potential flooding on the Greenway. Lights are no longer required after the time change as we should be in by dark at 7:00. Consider planning to stay for dinner after with the other riders. This is a great opportunity to get to know others. Thursday mornings at Mesker are back. We have spent the last two months at Newburgh on Thursday mornings because the roads there are cleared in the winter better than the west side ones. Thursday night rides at Newburgh Old Dam is a new addition. Again only the 17 mile route is on the schedule for a 5:30 start.
