A tribute to Marshall "Major" Taylor



From Mario Leavell, July 25, 2020:

Visiting the east coast this weekend I had to make a special trip to Worcester, MA. The adoption hometown of Marshal Taylor aka Major Taylor "the Worcester Whirlwind". This monument features a two-sided sculpture wall, 10 feet high and 12 feet, 4 inches wide, serving as a wind break for the library entrance and anchoring an outdoor plaza suited for reflection and contemplation.

One side of the wall is inscribed with text explaining Major Taylor's life story, under a 4-footby-8-foot bronze bas relief sculpture of track bike racers in action. The other side features a larger-thanlife, three-dimensional figure of Major Taylor, with his bicycle in high relief, in front of a velodrome portrayed in bas relief. I also went by George Street where they have the George Street Bike Challenge

For Major Taylor.

This is a two-block quad-buster that was a training ground for 1899 world champion Major Taylor. It's one rider at a time against the clock in this steep uphill time trial in downtown Worcester. The distance is 500 feet, and the average grade is 18 percent. The contest is open to riders age 12 and up.
