

Speaking of everyone, where are you? I've just seen the mileage stats for the year and only 17 people have turned in miles so far. Remember you can always go to the EBC web site and send in your ride miles. Here's the link to turn in miles. http://www.evansvillebicycleclub. org/forms/

Now that the weather is getting warmer, I hope to see more members at club rides. One excuse you can't use for not riding is fear of getting lost.

I need to give a **BIG shout out to Diane** Bies and Bill Vogel, who went out and did a Dan Henry route marking blitz last month. I am not sure how many miles all of our routes cover, but it's a lot! For our new members, "What is a Dan Henry?" The Dan Henry is the name of the guy who came up with the idea of directional pavement markings, used to guide participants along the route of organized bicycling events.

The markers themselves indicate the direction of travel. Normally the markings consist of a circle with a vertical

line from the edge of the circle pointing in the direction of travel (straight ahead, left turn, right turn). Sometimes inside or near the circle are letters to Identify the name of the route, in case there would be an intersection that several routes pass through.

So if you see Bill or Diane (easily identifiable by a white index finger) give them a thank you for getting you back to your car or the finish line of a route.

In other Club news, The Great Pumpkin Metric is a go for 2021! EBC is proceeding with preparations to host the GPM on October 3rd. Let's hope Covid cases continue to go down and we can look forward to this great fall classic event.
